It explores the influence of digital media and seeks to open up a discussion about support available for young people. The production will be available to tour Wales and beyond from March 2026. With a cast of 3, written by Paul Swift, it considers the lived experiences of young people in RCT. The production will be suitable for small scale venues and community spaces.

Happy Dragons Theatre

Siôl (Shawl) is a verse drama which tells the stories of two Welsh women, Anwen (born in 1905) and Mary (born in 1939), who live through major events in Welsh history, including the Welsh religious revival, the Senghenydd Mining Disaster, the Cardiff blitz, and the the evolution of the NHS and mental health care in Wales. Awen and Mary's lives connect through a traditional Welsh nursing shawl. Their stories are rooted in the social history of Wales.

At its heart, Siôl is a play about strength, resilience, caring and the way a sense of community shapes these values. The content of the ply is rooted in historical documents and verbatim testimony. In September 2025, the first performance of Siôl will take place at Theatr Brycheiniog. Thereafter, we aim to tour the production to various venues in South Wales. At each venue, members of the community will be invited to participate in a workshop focusing on one of the episodes from the play and, thereafter, to join the 'Community Chorus'. The aspiration is to find a venue where the 'separate Community Choruses can join the professional cast in a 'large-scale performance of Siol.
